Class Option 1:

Work on any projects that you have already started or something new you'd like to try. Bring your patterns, fabric, and sewing equipment.

Class Option 2:

Use the free Quilt Pattern from MODA Fabrics "Lady Luck" by Robert Kaufman Fabrics. Fabric requirements listed below. Finished quilt measures 66" by 80" (Queen mattress top size). Difficulty rating: Beginner.

All attendees should bring:

- Working sewing machine (no loaners will be available) Be sure to have bobbins, bobbin case and foot pedal. Clean and oil your machine and change needle before coming to workshop.
- Seam ripper
- Neutral colored thread (beige, white, or gray)
- Pin cushion and pins
- Pattern
- Fabric scissors
- Rotary cutter (extra blades)
- 6" x 24" ruler
- Small iron and ironing pad
- Sewing accessory tote (extra needles, Band-Aids, Kleenex, paper, pencil, etc.)
- A light for your workspace
- A cushion/pad or comfortable chair from home (Grange will provide folding chairs)

• Lunch and beverages (the nearest store to purchase food is Three Corners or Myrtle Ave Market). There will be a table away from sewing projects for you to enjoy your lunch.

The Grange will provide:

- 2 Cutting tables with 36" cutting mats
- 2 Ironing stations with irons
- A limited number of extension cords and power strips. Please bring your own if you can.
- 6' folding tables to be shared by 2 quilters
- Folding chairs
- 3 hanging display walls and one 3 fold display unit.

Notes:

- Arrive at 9:30 AM for set up and pick your spot to sew (no sewing until 10 AM). Stay after 4 PM (when all sewing ends) to help clean up.
- As projects are completed or quilt blocks are sewn, pictures will be taken.
- You will be given a name tag. Feel free to bring one from home if you prefer.
- If you are using the "Lucky Lady" pattern, it is recommended that you cut out the Jelly Roll at home or bring your own cutting mat.



Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From the Roll Up:

Separate the Roll Up into ten sets of three strips. Sew the three strips together, lengthwise, then press the seams to one side. Cut:

six 6-1/2" squares from each sewn strip set.

Note: Eighty squares are needed to make the quilt.

From Fabric A, cut:

thirty-nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-one 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles two-hundred and forty 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 2-1/2" squares Sew the remaining strips together end-to-end, then subcut: two 2-1/2" x 68-1/2" inner side borders two 2-1/2" x 58-1/2" inner top and bottom borders

From Fabric C, cut:


seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut: two 4-1/2" x 72-1/2" outer side borders two 4-1/2" x 66-1/2" outer top and bottom borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks

Step 1: Place a 2-1/2" Fabric A square on three corners of a 6-1/2" strip square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on each 2-1/2" square. Sew on the marked lines, then trim the excess fabric 1/4" away from the seams. Make eighty snowballed units.



Step 2: Sew four snowballed units together following the Block Assembly Diagram. Make twenty blocks.



Assemble the Horizontal Sashing Strips

Step 3: Sew four 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric A strips and three 2-1/2" Fabric B squares together as shown. Press the seams towards the sashing rectangles. Make four horizontal sashing strips.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 4: Arrange the blocks in five rows of four blocks. Place a 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric A strip in between each block. Sew the blocks and sashing strips together to form a row. Press the seams towards the sashing rectangles. Repeat for each row.

Step 5: Place a horizontal sashing strip between each row. Sew the rows and horizontal sashing strips together to form the quilt center. Press open or towards the sashing strips.

Step 6: Sew a 2-1/2" x 68-1/2" inner side border to both sides of the quilt. Press towards the borders. Sew a 2-1/2" x 58-1/2" inner side top and bottom border to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press towards the border.

Step 7: Sew a 4-1/2" x 72-1/2" outer side border to both sides of the quilt. Press towards the borders. Sew a 4-1/2" x 66-1/2" outer top and bottom border to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press towards the border.

Your quilt top is now complete. Baste, bind, quilt, and enjoy!

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
